



Guideline for Further Education as Part of the Doctorate

According to §6 para. 3 of the Doctoral Regulations, doctoral candidates should go through further education. The number of further education days as defined in the Doctorate Regulations is eight. Further education can take place on three levels:

1. Specialized Education

All TU courses at Master's level are available here. In addition, in-depth basic lectures are offered specifically for doctoral candidates via the Graduate Academy Grad-TUBS.

2. Interdisciplinary Education

This includes further education measures in the areas of personal development, communication, methodological skills, leadership skills, career planning, company foundation, copyright, good scientific practice and language courses. Amongst others, GradTUBS offers are available here.

3. Scientific Communication

This includes active participation in summer schools, internal departmental colloquia, publications, conference contributions, taking on teaching tasks, participation in the preparation of research proposals, visits to external scientific institutions or companies, e.g. as part of cooperation projects or scientific collaboration.

The selection of the events to be attended and of visits to external scientific institutions or companies is carried out by the supervisor together with the doctoral candidate. The supervisor determines the number of training days recognized for each measure. For seminars, the number corresponds to the actual number of seminar days; for other measures, it corresponds to the time spent on content-related work.
